




Granted Survival – Key Factor?

- Materialistic vs. Postmaterialistic Values i.e.
- Survival vs. Self-Expression/Freedom Values (World Value Survey, 2000, Country Scores)
- Cultural Shift emerging among generations who have grown up taking survival for granted - it moves from Survival to Self-Expression, but the economic crisis strengthened the materialist value orientation
- CEE countries survival values share decline, but still prevails


2000 vs. 2012 - is Survival taken for granted today?






Registration for "2% Tax"




Context: 2% Tax Assignation (mil.EUR)



Revenue Structure of CSOs (without earned income and fees) 2005 – 2011 (%)




Structure of Revenue of CSOs 2010 (without Earned income and fees)






Community investments (€) by CFs 2010-2013
